For I was a stranger and you welcomed me

Do you remember the last time you went camping or on any overnight trip? Perhaps it was only for one or two days, or maybe it was for a full week, a month, or even longer. Regardless of its length, you know the feeling of exhaustion being on the road, when you're tired, but alert, and if you are traveling with kids, that tiresome yet endearing little phrase: Are we there yet?

In September, the refugee program at Catholic Social Services of Southern Nebraska in Lincoln welcomed a family of nine from Afghanistan. They were weary from the two days of travel and ready to have a warm meal and fall asleep in their new home. But unfortunately, a warm, culturally appropriate meal and drawn up beds would have to wait a few weeks. Instead, a couple of hotel rooms would need to suffice. With the lack of affordable housing, especially for larger families, securing homes prior to our clients' arrivals has been extremely challenging. Staying in hotel rooms also limits their accessibility to a full kitchen. We do our best to provide for them and make the temporary housing work, but it's not ideal and certainly not the homecoming that we desire for them. Thankfully, we have a solution.

Last month, our Board of Directors approved our request to purchase a beautiful two-story home near downtown Lincoln. We are working diligently with several community partners and friends of the agency to zone it as a duplex with five bedrooms on the main floor and upstairs and a two-bedroom unit downstairs. Just a couple of blocks from Sacred Heart parish, a community and neighborhood that myself and my staff have such a love for, it's near several ethnic grocery stores, close to schools K-12 with English Language Learner (ELL) programs and is situated along the bus route - not to mention, it's just a couple of minutes drive from our offices. Our staff can't wait to fill this home with donated furniture that we have received and decorate it with all the love and care that you would imagine welcoming weary travelers.

With your support we continue to perform the Works of Mercy in response to the call of God. For I was a stranger and you welcomed me (Matthew 25:35).

Bringing Hope in the Good Life couldn't be done without the support of our donors, volunteers and community partners. In fact our Catholic Social Services Outreach Center in Imperial often collaborates with several community partners across the region to help our neighbors in need.

Recently we had the privilege of working with St. Patrick Church in Imperial and Educational Service Unit 15 in Trenton to help a family of five in desperate need of food and financial support. Dad is injured and unable to work and Mom is battling cancer. It doesn't take much for a family to fall behind in bills, especially these days when we're all facing inflation and the rising cost of goods and services, and when you add illness or any other setback

at work or a transportation issue it doesn't take much at all. And once you do fall behind, it's hard to catch up.
Unfortunately, this particular family's circumstance is not unlike many of the other families we help each and every day.

Together with our community partners, we were blessed to deliver 13 boxes of food and a check to help cover rent and several other utility bills. Mom, Dad and their three children were incredibly grateful for the support!

This past summer, I was contacted by the Rape &

Domestic Violence Agency (RDVA) in North Platte. They were asking if we could help with a woman who had fled Ohio after years of domestic violence. She came to Nebraska to live with family, but they were taking advantage of her and it had become an unsafe environment. RDVA helped her secure an apartment and she was in need of a bed, a couch, and some end

Thanks to our generous donors we were able to provide Brenda a gently used couch (which turned out to be her favorite color green) that she thought was beautiful and just the right firmness, as well as two end tables, and a

brand new bed. To brighten her day I also purchased a new welcome sign for Brenda to hang on her front door. She couldn't wait to hang it on her door and thanked me numerous times after a 30+ minute conversation in which I let her share her story, sorrows, and how they had turned to joy. As Brenda said, she was "safe and secure in my own place" she was relishing in the level of independence she had never felt before. On that Monday in June, we provided Brenda with some physical supplies, but moreover we provided her a great deal of Hope for her future as evidenced by the big smile on her face. Loving our neighbor goes beyond what you may think to love your neighbor includes being a good steward of the blessings God has bestowed upon you. This looks different for each person but can include making gifts of assets, time, or other resources you may possess.

Cash donations are a simple and tax efficient way to give

charitably to a cause that means a lot to you.

Establishing a Donor Advised Fund is a quick and easy way to support Catholic Social Services of Southern Nebraska (CSS). That's what Brad and Donna Havlat of Crete, Nebraska did. "So when we want to make a donation to Catholic Social Services, we just ask the Catholic Foundation to send CSS a check for the amount we wish to donate from this fund," said Donna. "While we could have set up the Donor Advised Fund through other financial

professionals, we chose the Catholic Foundation to take care of this part of our giving."

Is your wealth tied up in assets such as land, stocks, livestock, or grain? CSS can help you transform these assets (via the Catholic Foundation) into charitable giving, endowments, donor advised funds, or charitable trusts while you're living or planning for your estate.

The Havlat's deposit money into their Donor Advised Fund from the sale of grain grown on their farm. "When a load of grain is hauled to the local elevator to sell, the money from the sale of that grain is transferred into our Donor Advised Fund, completing the gift," Donna said. "We don't collect a check for a grain sale, and therefore

we avoid income tax. There is no income tax

deduction because there is no income." The Havlat's are also able to deduct the business expenses associated with raising the donated crop and avoid

paying self-employment tax.

If you can't give through cash or assets right now, volunteering your time and talent is another great way to benefit CSS. There are volunteer opportunities in our Food Markets, Thrift Stores, and other areas of CSS. Just
